Welcome back to the Spring Term 2017...how is it possible that we are already in 2017?!!

I am pleased to say that we have had a fantastic start to the brand new year and all the children are working very hard, although some are still a little bit tired from all the festive family fun so a few early nights this week I think.

While we are thinking of getting ourselves back to school, can I remind you all that the school needs to be secured for all children's safety at 8:50am, so please ensure that all pupils are in school by this time. We have seen an improvement in this area but know that there is still room for improvement. Our admin and Welfare team are still needing to record, escort and telephone parents which is using up valuable time.

As you will already be aware, we said a farewell to Mrs Williamson at the end of December. We spent lots of time trying to decide the best way forward for our school and have made two appointments to continue on with her role. So we welcome back Mrs King who has been away on maternity leave with her second child who will be our KS2 Deputy and Mrs Farooq-Ayub will take on the responsibilities for KS1.

The Spring term is longer than usual this year, so we have packed it full of exciting learning opportunities for the children to enjoy. This term we see three year groups go off on their residential adventures starting with the Year 2's at Stibbington in February, followed by the Year 3's at Aylmerton and Year 4's at Horstead. All information regarding these visits will be coming home shortly if you have not already received it.

Next week clubs will resume once again. You should have received a letter with all of the new clubs available for the term. Please return the slips promptly so that arrangements can be made for all children. Letters will be sent home to confirm places.

As your child's Head Teacher, it is very important to myself and the school staff that your child enjoys coming to school and is enthusiastic about their learning. Please could you continue to ensure you read the learning diary and add a parental comment in the parent section so that we also have your feedback about learning. To achieve high quality learning diaries, we will endeavour to spend as much time as we can with the children to complete them until they are independent and can be completed at home.

The staff and I always meet and greet our families at the beginning and end of the day. We like to take the time to get to know our families and gather feedback on what is happening in school each day. If you have any suggestions you would like to contribute please complete the Parents Comment slip at the back of this letter and return it to school. We try as much as possible to use all parents ideas in our daily work - thank you for your support.






A thank you from the children




