Welcome to a brand new academic year, how quickly did the Summer go!

I am pleased to say that we have had a fantastic start to the brand new year, all of the children have come in very settled and we are amazed once again at how brilliantly the Reception children have settled into life at school they are all stars.

As we begin a new academic year we not

only welcome our brand new Reception pupils we also welcome some new members of staff. Joining our teaching team we have Miss Johnson (Year 2), Miss Dooley (Year 4), Miss Mescall (Year 4) and Mr Pye (Year 5). Also joining the Southfields Team we have Mrs Payne senior leader over seeing our special needs team and pupils alongside Mrs Magee, Mrs Ward, Mrs Barnard and Mrs Pook. And finally joining our Teaching Assistant Team we have Mrs Mallia who will be joining the Reception Team. I am sure you will all make them feel welcome and support them in their new posts.

So as with the start of any term, there are a few reminders that we wish to share with you all. Firstly can we please remind you that the school needs to be secured for all children's safety at 8:50am, so please ensure that all pupils are in school by this time. At the end of last term we saw a big improvement in attendance however the admin and Welfare team were still needing to record, escort and telephone parents which uses up valuable time you could help us better with. So if your child is poorly and unable to attend school, please ensure you telephone the school and leave a message to let us know that they are unable to attend and why we have a dedicated line for this. You can also use Class Dojo if you prefer to notify the teachers who will update the registers.

As you all know we have a school uniform. We believe that a uniform helps the children to take pride in their appearance and helps to develop a positive attitude to each school day. We do ask the children to keep as smart as possible and take pride in their uniforms by tucking in their shirts and doing their best not to get too dirty at break and lunchtimes. This is also the same for PE. We have very basic PE requirements and ask that you help us in ensuring the children follow these simple guides. For indoor PE a white t-shirt/polo shirt and a pair of blue/black shorts. For outdoor PE a white t-shirt/polo shirt, blue or black tracksuit/shorts and suitable trainers. It is really important that children to wear correct clothing for physical activities. To also help us to help you in keeping all of your children's items together can you ensure that all items are clearly labelled, as you can imagine trying to find a white t-shirt belonging to one pupil in a sea of 30 can be quite tricky when they have no names. We want to do our best to minimise lost property and this will help us return any items found to the correct pupil.

You should receive a clubs letter today. Please return the slips promptly so that arrangements can be made for all children we have a huge number of clubs and I would like to thank the staff for giving up their time to run them. Letters will be sent home to confirm places once this has been organised and the dates on which the clubs will run.

This is going to be one busy term, at the end of the letter are some of the important events and dates for September however in addition to this we have also added this terms dates to the school website under the calendar section. I can't wait to see where the children take their learning this year.
