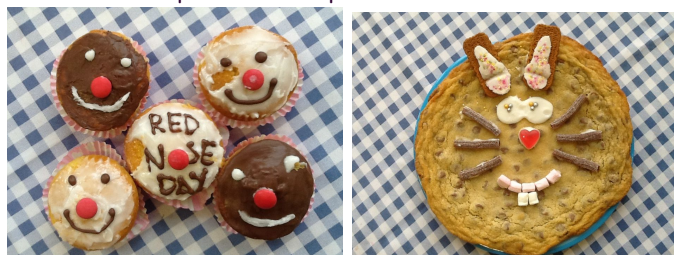
What did we do to help support others?
